# Empowering Young Men with Skills for Life

In rural areas of Sindh, job opportunities are scarce, and technical education is often out of reach.

Through our motorbike repairing course, young men are being given the tools to change their future.

Over 200 boys have already been equipped with life-changing technical skills, thanks to the collective support of many dedicated partners and friends.

## **Celebrating Success: Graduation with Dignity**

At the end of each course cycle, a formal certificate and tool kit distribution ceremony is held — attended by students' families, trainers, community elders, and PCDP representatives.

Each graduate receives a certificate and tool kit — a practical step toward self-reliance and income generation.





# **Beyond Training: Building Entrepreneurs**

To complement their technical skills, participants also attend a focused Entrepreneurship Workshop, where they learn:

- Basic business planning
- Customer care
- Financial literacy
- Workshop setup tips

With these additional skills, many graduates have gone on to start their own motorbike repair shops or join existing ones — empowered, equipped, and motivated to succeed.

# From Trainees to Entrepreneurs

The outcomes of this initiative are already visible in the communities::



- Several graduates have launched their own motorbike repair workshops in their villages.
- These small businesses are not only providing income for the trainees, but also offering affordable repair services to community members.
- The graduates are becoming role models for other youth proving that skills + opportunity = transformation.

#### **Mini Success Stories**

#### 1. Shagan

"From Rider to Repairman"

"Before the course, I only knew how to ride a bike — not how to fix one," says Shagan, a 19-year-old from Shadi Pali. After graduating from the PRVT motorbike repairing course, he set up a small repair stall outside his village using the toolkit he received. Now, Shagan earns enough to support his parents and plans to expand his business by training his younger brother.

"This skill has given me hope. I feel proud and confident every day."

### 2. Dhanraj

"Fixing Bikes, Fueling Dreams"

Dhanraj, 17, had never seen the inside of a motorbike engine before joining the course. Today, he runs a roadside workshop in his village and gets 4–6 customers a day. He credits his success to the practical training and business tips he received during the project.

"I'm not just repairing bikes — I'm building my life."
